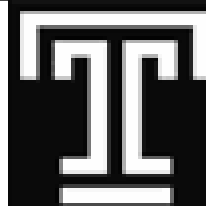

U.S. TORT COSTS AT RECORD LEVELS

A study conducted by Tillinghast reports that U.S. tort costs are reaching record levels. Tort costs are rising an average of 5.9% per year. Despite these record levels, the average yearly rise has declined from 14% per year.

The reason for this decline is the settling of asbestos claims. Other results of the study find that U.S. tort costs out pace international tort costs, and commercial tort costs out pace personal tort costs.
