Volunteerism/Charity Work

- **Penny Drive** - The Sigma Chapter raised \$300 for the New York City Firefighters 9-11 Disaster Relief Fund in September.

- **Philabundance** - Members organized food packages to be distributed to needy families for Thanksgiving.
- **Thanksgiving Food Drive** - Canned and dry goods were collected throughout the month of November to assist **Philabundance** in their food collection and distribution.
- **Philadelphia Excursion** - Members from the Sigma Chapter and other local chapters volunteered with **Habitat for Humanity** and the **Fairmount Park Commission**.
