SPENCER SCHOLARS

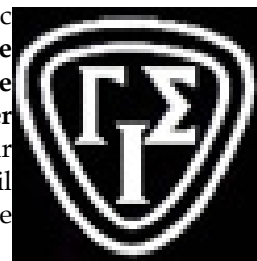
