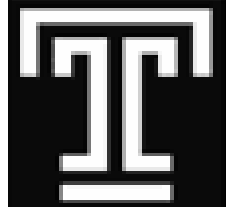

Sen. Arlen Specter, Republican of PA, introduced bipartisan legislation for a \$140 billion U.S. asbestos compensation fund Tuesday, April 19, despite objections to parts of the plan by fellow Republicans on the Senate Judiciary Committee. Sen. Specter, chairman of the committee, said he was filing the bill to take asbestos claims out of the court system.

Asbestos, used in building materials, auto parts and other products for decades, is linked to cancer and other diseases. Injury claims have forced many companies into bankruptcy.

The proposed fund would be financed by companies facing asbestos lawsuits and their insurers. Victims would no longer be able to sue, but would go to the fund for payment. Sen. Specter has been trying for months to build a bipartisan consensus around his plan. But many Republicans, who have 55 votes in the 100-seat Senate, have echoed business concerns that the fund might not finally cap their asbestos liability.

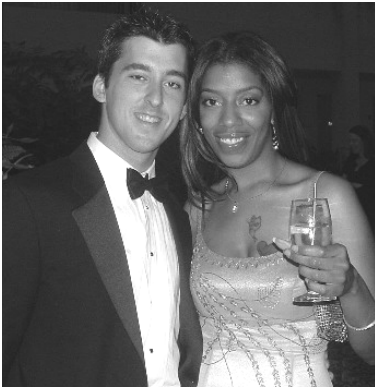

GAMMA IOTA SIGMA'S 14TH ANNUAL DINNER

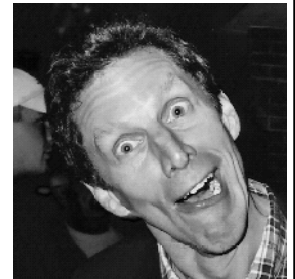
