John DeMartini joined Towers Perrin Re in August of 1998 and is currently a Senior Vice President, Principal and Catastrophe Risk Management Practice Leader. John works with clients in evaluating their exposure to natural and man-made hazards such as earthquakes, hurricanes, tornado/hail storms and terrorist acts. These projects include exposure profiling and mapping, portfolio risk analyses, reinsurance risk transfer analyses and strategic capital allocation studies.

A focal point of these consulting relationships is assisting clients with the development of their risk metrics, the measurements used to quantify and assess their catastrophe exposures. John has consulted with over 200 hundred insurers, reinsurers, financial institutions and regulatory entities over the course of his 20-year career.

John began his career with Liberty Mutual Insurance Company and then joined Skandia America Reinsurance Co. in New York as a Treaty Underwriter. He then became Vice President and Manager of Skandia's Underwriting Services Department, where was responsible for catastrophe risk management and the placement of retrocession programs. John joined Risk Management Solutions, Inc, a leading catastrophe modeling firm, in January of 1993 and became Vice President of Global Sales. He received a B.A. degree from the State University of New York.
