Roy Reinard is currently serving in the capacity of Principal of the Reinard Insurance Agency, a position which he has held since 1977. Along with this position, Mr. Reinard also served in the Pennsylvania House of Representatives 178th Legislative District. During his tenure as a Representative he served on the following committees: Chairman - Liquor Control Committee (Feb. 2000-November 30, 2002), Chairman - Urban Affairs (1997-Feb. 2000), Insurance (1983-November 30, 2002), Commerce and Economic Development (1993-96), and Environmental Resources and Energy (1995-96).

Mr. Reinard was first elected to public office as Auditor of Northampton Township and has served in the State Legislature from 1982 until his retirement November 30, 2002. His agenda included streamlining state government, reforming the welfare system, cutting personal and business taxes, enacting tough crime measures such as "three strikes and you're out," increasing state education funding, and protecting the environment through sensible development policies.

Mr. Reinard graduated from West Chester State College in 1977 with a Bachelor of Science in Political Science and Education.
