THIS WEEK'S MEETING IS IN TUTTLEMAN 101

Lance J. Ewing has extensive experience in the field of insurance and risk management including his current position as Executive Director Risk Management for Park Place Entertainment. Prior to this position, he served as senior director of risk management for GES Exposition Services, and in risk management and loss control capacities for various insurance companies including Lumbermen's Underwriting Alliance, Pennsylvania Hospital Insurance Company (PHICO) and New York Lumberman's Insurance Trust. Mr. Ewing was also employed in the risk management department for the School District of Philadelphia. He began his career with the H.J. Heinz Company, specializing in security, safety and workers' compensation investigations.

Mr. Ewing received his master's degree in Public Administration (Law) from the University of Pittsburgh and completed his second master's degree in Occupational Health & Safety. In addition to his Associate in Risk Management (ARM) designation and his Certified Risk Manager (CRM) designation, he is a matriculated Chartered Property Casualty Underwriter (CPCU) candidate.

Mr. Ewing serves as RIMS president. He also was RIMS first vice president and chief risk officer, vice president professional education and vice president external affairs. He teaches risk management as a faculty member for the National Alliance for Insurance Education & Research. Mr. Ewing also serves as a Board member for the Academy of Producer Insurance. He was a member of the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) Safety to Life Committee and served on the Environmental Risk Management Committee of the American Society of Testing Materials (ASTM). He is an active member of the American Society of Safety Engineers (ASSE).

Mr. Ewing has authored several articles on safety and health, risk management and workers' compensation. He is frequently interviewed by various trade journals regarding OSHA, EPA, risk control, and risk management issues. In addition, he has testified in both Federal and State hearings on risk management legislation and issues. Recently, he completed a speaking tour to promote risk management in Eastern European countries and to their governments. Mr. Ewing continues to be a strong and outspoken supporter of the risk management profession.

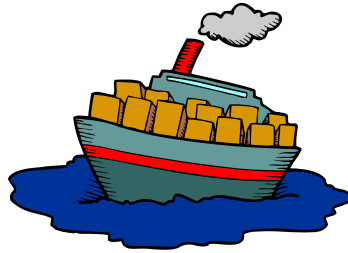
TOP 10 LIST O' THE WEEK
