## ACING THE INTERVIEW: TIPS FOR SUCCESS

- RESEARCH!** This should be your first step before interviewing with any company. Look at the company's website and research them in the news so that when the interviewer asks the questions, "What do you know about our company?" or "Why do you want to work for us?" you can impress them with your knowledge.
- Arrive on-time and on-time means fifteen minutes early. Allowing yourself this extra time will ensure you arrive when you are supposed to, but may also give you time to sit down and relax before you head into your interview.
- Make eye-contact and smile! It seems so simple, but sometimes nerves can get the better of us so consciously remind yourself to do these things.
- Bring a note pad - Remember an interview is not just about the company representative getting to know you, but also about you getting to know the company. You may want to jot down a few notes about why you would want to work there.
- Prepare questions for the interviewer ahead of time. Insightful questions about the insurance industry or the specific company you are interviewing for can set you apart from your competition. Make sure your questions are relevant, intelligent, and interesting.
- Send a hand-written Thank You whenever possible! You have probably been told to do this many times, but even still, most people opt for the e-mail Thank You. Sending a hand-written one can make you stand out.
