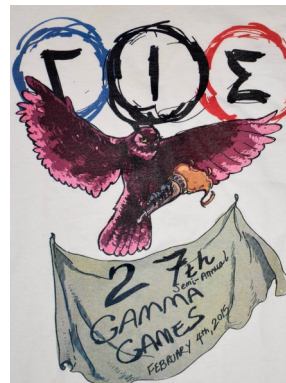
27th Semi-Annual Gamma Games!
